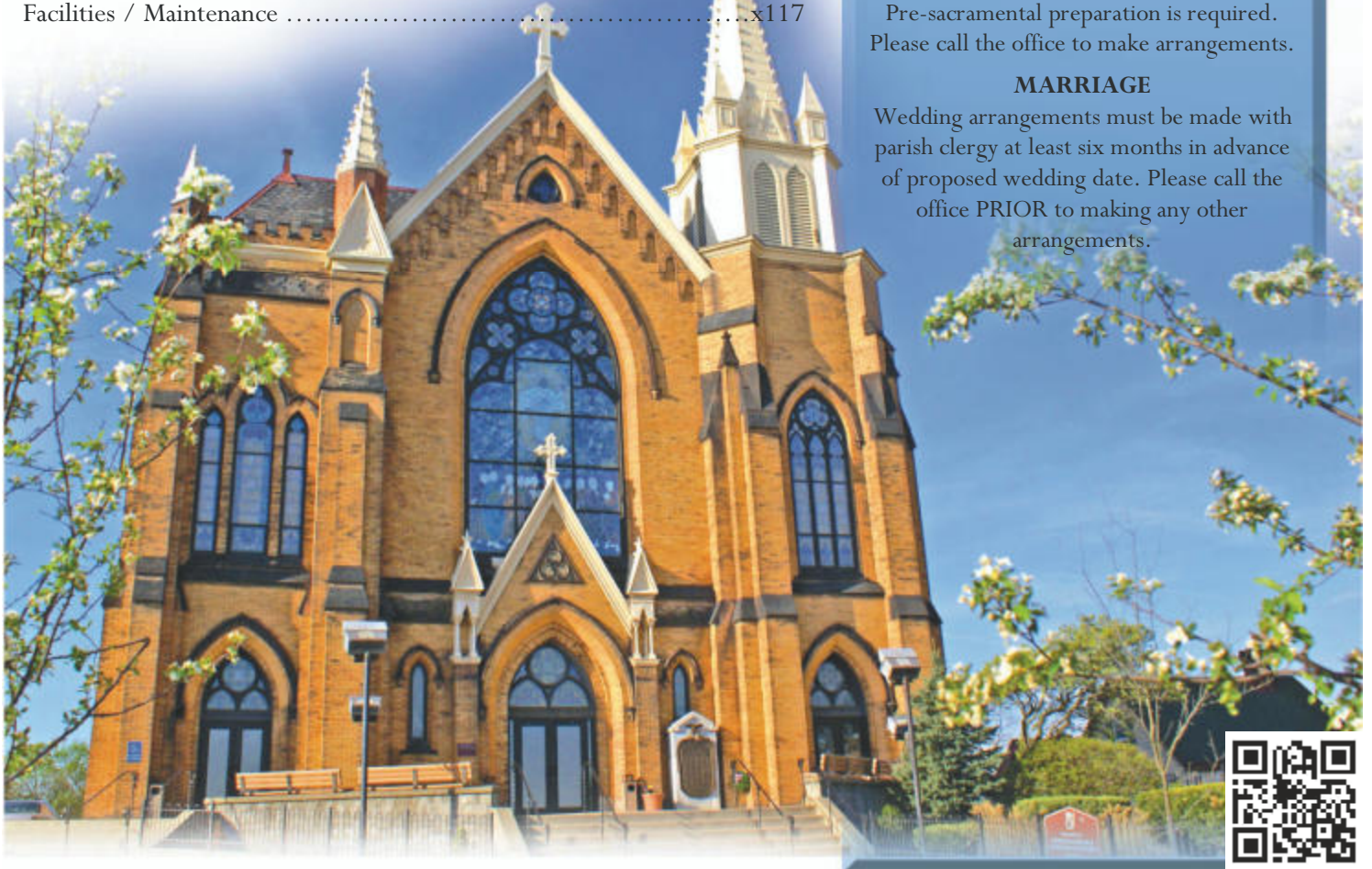

Music “Notes” with Amanda:

A Sunday of Contrasts

This weekend we focus on contrasts. For example, the gospel speaks of rich people “putting in large sums” at the treasury, while a poor woman puts only a few coins in. (Mark 12:38-44) “From her poverty, [she] has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood,” Jesus says.

There’s such a contrast between rich and poor here! Similarly, the Gospel Acclamation verse this weekend quotes the Beatitudes:

“Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.” (Matthew 5:3)

For this reason, we are singing “Blest Are They” (#735) this weekend at our weekend liturgies. The first verse quotes the same lines from Matthew’s Gospel:

Blest are they, the poor in spirit/theirs is the kingdom of God.

Blest are they, full of sorrow/they shall be consoled.

These scriptural lines of contrast make our faith seem so black-and-white, and yet so contradictory. I’ve always loved the Beatitudes (it was the Gospel passage we chose at our wedding) because it gives me such hope. When we feel at our lowest, God tells us that we are still favored the most highly in the Kingdom. And truthfully, it’s a great scripture passage to remind us to show mercy, kindness and compassion upon others who may seem below us...for in the eyes of God, they are in His highest favor.

I tried to carry forward the message of mercy and compassion towards the rich woman in our Gospel just a little further. Our opening hymn is “All Are Welcome” (#850). While this hymn does not quote the Beatitudes, it still carries the message that Jesus preaches in our Gospel. He celebrates her contribution, big or small as it is. For in Jesus’s eyes, all are welcome. (Do you see what I did there?)

All the Angels and ornaments on the tree are color-coded to make selection easier for you. Please read below to identify what the different colors specify.

The cost of each gift is still recommended at around \$20.00. Individual gift suggestions are attached to the red angel.
